Class News – 12th June 2026

This week in **Little Learners**, we have enjoyed learning all about transport in Space! The children have been creating their own rockets using a variety of materials and resources. The children also designed their own rockets by combining shapes and drawing around them. We celebrated some fantastic designs! We have also explored sequencing a short story using words such as; first, then and next to talk about different parts of a well known story, The Three Little Pigs.

Reminder; We are inviting Little Learners' important male role models for our Father's day stay and play session on Thursday 18th June 1.45pm-2.45pm. Please reply to our event listed on Class Dojo if you are able to attend.

We have been really impressed with the **Year 1's** writing this week. They have been writing words ending in the 'er' and 'est' suffix'. They are all working so hard to form their letters correctly and to use capital letters, finger spaces and full stops. We have been challenging the children to use different adjectives in their work. During play times the children have been very creative this week and have enjoyed making many different models.

This week in **Year 3**, we have been exploring the oceans. We were very lucky to join a live lesson with Steve Backshall while he explored underwater in the UK. In our geography lesson, we learned about ocean currents and discovered that differences in water temperature, saltiness, and wind can cause currents to form. We then carried out a practical investigation using hot water with red dye and cold, salty water with blue dye to represent the Indian Ocean and the Arctic Ocean. We observed how the different temperatures and salt levels caused the water to move, helping us understand how ocean currents are formed.

This week, within Geography, **Year 5** have looked at and compared two rivers, the River Rhine in Switzerland and the River Severn in Gloucestershire. We then looked into the features of mountains. Test your child's knowledge - which is the longest river, the Severn or the Rhine? Where is the source the River Severn?

This term so far, our focus book has been How to Hide a Lion by Helen Stephens. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the story and have used it as a stimulus for their writing. We have been learning how to write instructions and the children have created some amazing plans for how to hide a lion. They have worked incredibly hard on their independent writing, showing great resilience and concentration throughout. We have been particularly impressed with their labels and the effort they have put into recording their ideas clearly. Well done, **Reception!**

Reception class trip payment is now on parentpay.

In **Year 2** this week we have started to make our paper mache islands. We worked with a partner to draw the outline and start covering the base. We are very excited to see how they turn out! In English we have started a new class text- Rosie Revere-Engineer. We have immersed ourselves in the illustrations and made predictions about the story.



This week **Year 4** have been acting out parts of our text in English, thinking about how the main character is feeling in different parts of the story, in the

photo we are shocked! We watched a live lesson from Steve Backshall all about oceans and in science we learnt about common appliances that are powered by mains or battery powered.

This week **Year 6** attended the leavers service at Gloucester Cathedral. We were right at the front and fully engaged in every song, story, prayer, reading and chat from all involved... We are extremely proud of their behavior throughout and it was a joy to celebrate these wonderful children as they come to the end of their primary school journey... they really did shine like stars!

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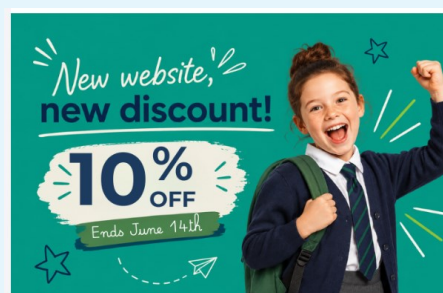
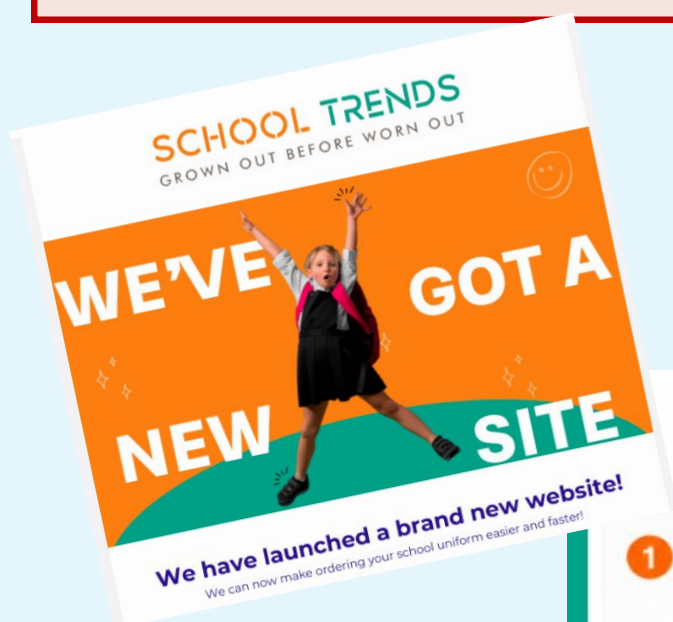

Supporting Trips and Enrichment Activities at Norton

At Norton, we feel incredibly fortunate to be able to organise a wide range of trips, workshops and activities that enhance your children's learning. These experiences provide valuable knowledge, broaden horizons and create lasting memories during their time at our school.

In order to offer these opportunities, we do ask families for financial contributions. As these contributions are voluntary, we cannot demand payment. However, if we do not receive sufficient contributions to cover the cost of a trip or activity, we will unfortunately have no choice but to cancel it moving forward.

The cost of coaches, entrance fees, and external providers visiting school continues to rise. Regrettably, the school budget is not able to absorb these increasing costs. We are extremely grateful to our PTA for the support they provide; however, they are not able to fully fund every activity we organise. This is why parental contributions remain essential.

We are mindful of the financial pressures on families and carefully limit the number of trips and activities across the year to avoid frequent requests for contributions. Our aim is always to provide enriching experiences without placing unnecessary burden on parents. However, we would much rather continue offering these opportunities than cancel them altogether.

For example, for the Diwali workshops that took place in November, we received only 56% of the total. This meant the school had to cover the remaining £613.50.

All trips and activities are available on ParentPay, and if you are in a position to do so, you are still able to contribute towards any events that have taken place earlier this academic year. We can accept cash, cheques or you can pay through the parentpay app or at a parentpay paypoint (if you would like details of a paypoint please ask the office)

We are truly grateful for your continued support in helping us provide these valuable experiences for your children. Without sufficient contributions, we will regrettably need to begin cancelling future trips and activities. If you are unable to pay for a trip/activity please call Mrs Farren as we are here to support you.

On Thursday 2nd July 2026, Reception will be visiting Cotswold Wildlife Park for an exciting school trip. Re: Corinium Museum Cirencester

On Tuesday 16th June 2026, Year 4 have an exciting trip to the Corinium Museum in Cirencester. We will explore the museum galleries as well as take part in an active workshop. Children will learn about everyday Roman life through a series of activities. They will get hands-on with mosaic making, Roman games, food and pottery and Roman clothing. This workshop brings Roman Britain to life in a practical way for the children. In the museum galleries, children will get the opportunity to explore and find a variety of Roman artefacts that link to the workshop. We will also be taking a walk to the Roman Amphitheatre in Cirencester.

We will leave school at 9.15am and return by home time at 3:15pm. Children will need a packed lunch, water bottle, suitable footwear and coat depending on the weather (we will be spending time outside for some of the day).

The cost of this trip is £19 per pupil. Although this is a voluntary contribution, we rely on parental payments to cover the full cost of the visit. Healthy recipe of the week..



Warm bananas and yoghurt recipe

Ingredients

- 20g low-fat spread
- 4 ripe bananas, peeled and sliced into diagonal chunks
- zest and juice of 1 orange
- 4 tablespoons low-fat Greek-style natural yoghurt



Method

1. Heat a non-stick frying pan over a medium-low heat and add the low-fat spread.
2. Add the banana pieces and fry gently for 2 minutes. Add the orange juice and cook for another 30 to 40 seconds. Sprinkle with the grated orange zest.

Take care not to overcook the bananas, or else they will go very mushy.

3. Divide into bowls and top each portion with 1 tablespoon of low-fat Greek yoghurt.

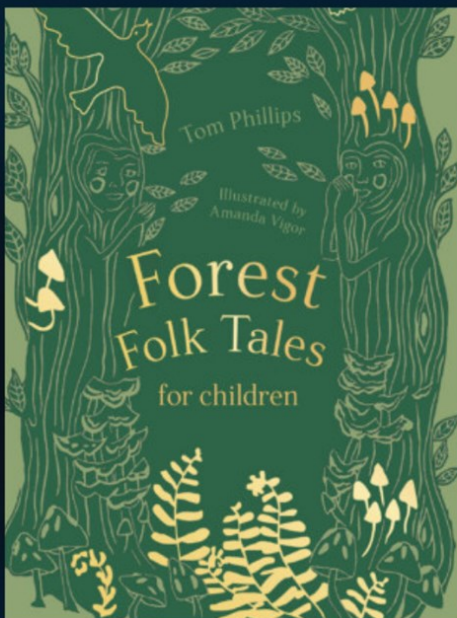
