Class News – 26th September 2025

This week in **Little Learners** we dived into the children's interest of sea creatures! Our activities were inspired by their curiosity and included ocean themed stories, mark making, and water play. The children practiced their fine motor skills through cutting and creative tasks, all linked to our theme. We also had lots of fun building dens.

In Geography recently, the children have been learning all about maps and human and physical features. On

Wednesday **Year 1** had a brilliant time walking into the village following maps and searching for human and physical features. We all had so much fun and the children behaved impeccably.

A big thank you to The Phelps and Don family who let us visit their farm this week and taught us about cows and different crops.

This week in **Reception**, the children have been exploring matching objects and pictures and starting to sort them into groups. They showed fantastic engagement, asking lots of mathematical questions to help clarify their thinking.

Matching is one of the earliest forms of sorting and marks the beginning of logical thinking. Through matching, children develop an understanding of one-to-one correspondence. This skill is an important stepping stone towards making sets, which is a precursor to counting. These foundations are vital for understanding key counting principles such as cardinality (knowing the last number counted represents the total in a set) and one-to-one correspondence (matching each object with one number as they count).

We are so proud of how curious and enthusiastic the children have been in their mathematical learning this week!

In **Year 2** this week we have been learning about place value. We have represented 2 digit numbers and identified the number of tens and ones the numbers have. We have used a place value chart and part-whole model to do this. In art, we have learnt about 'Pointillism' and experimented with different techniques.

This year in **Year 3**, we explored how the body moves, focusing on bones, muscles, and joints, and made split pin arm models to show movement. We also studied and analysed sources from the Stone Age. Additionally, we planned a magazine front cover, learning about desktop publishing in preparation to create it next week.

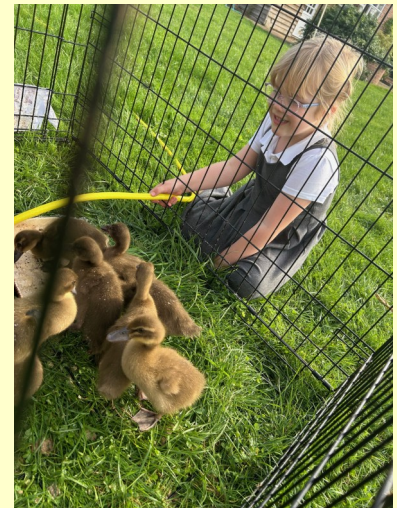
In **Year 4** this week we have been learning about the different features of our example text, The bird who didn't belong, and identifying these features in the text. In science, we have set up our experiment about tooth decay to see how different liquids have an effect on our teeth and build up of plaque. In music, we used the glockenspiels to practise playing the G note.

This week in PE **Year 5** enjoyed some competitive games of bench ball! Throughout the lesson they engaged in teamwork and looked at strategies to enable their teams to perform well to try and beat their opponents!

This week in **Year 6**, we have been analysing a text to look at the different language features used to create an affect on the reader. Specifically, the use of synonyms and antonyms and using a hyphen to create compound adjectives. In maths, we have been practising our multiplications skills through various methods to understand which works best for ourselves. In science, we classified plants into different categories, and in history we presented information about the house of wisdom in ancient Baghdad.

Rainbow fruit skewers

Serves 7

Easy

Prep: 15 mins

These vitamin-packed fruit skewers are a simple, colourful and fun way to get kids to eat fruit. They'll love helping to make them too.

Ingredients

7 raspberries

7 hulled strawberries

7 tangerine segments

7 cubes peeled mango

7 peeled pineapple chunks

7 peeled kiwi fruit chunks

7 green grapes

7 red grapes

14 blueberries

Method

Step 1

Take 7 wooden skewers and thread the following fruit onto each – 1 raspberry, 1 hulled strawberry, 1 tangerine segment, 1 cube of peeled mango, 1 chunk of peeled pineapple, 1 chunk of peeled kiwi, 1 green and 1 red grape, and finish off with 2 blueberries. Arrange in a rainbow shape and let everyone help themselves.

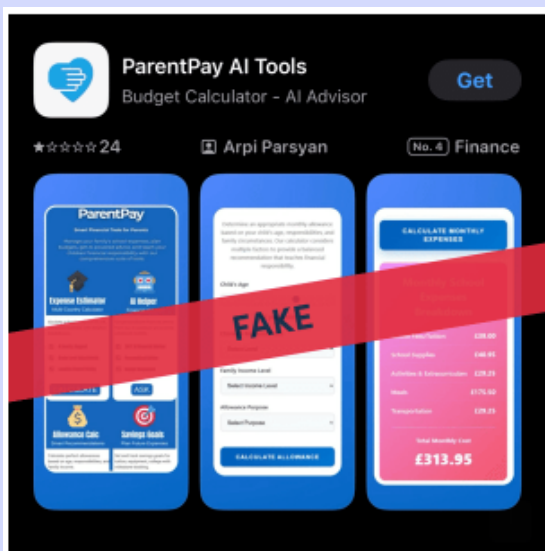

A message from caterlink regarding allergies/special diets:

Special diet menus

As we prepare for the new 2025 starters in September, it is crucial for us to receive information on pupils with allergies or intolerances as soon as possible to ensure we have the appropriate special diet menu in place in September. Please note that there is a four-week turnaround time for any new requests.

For a quick reminder, parents/guardians must complete in full the Caterlink Special Diet Request form (attached) and return to the office accompanied with medical evidence from an NHS source, including dietitian, GP, Allergy Specialist or Nurse. This can also be a screenshot of relevant evidence from the NHS app. This is in line with the guidance provided in the LACA Allergen Management Guidance, which is the governing body in terms of catering for education. Without medical evidence, Caterlink are unable to complete the LACA Risk Analysis, which is an essential analysis that is completed before catering to any set of allergies.

Please note Caterlink do not require forms to be complete if children have:

- No allergies/intolerances
- Do not want hot school dinners (only have packed lunches)
- Follow specific diets due to religious beliefs or personal preferences - likes/dislikes.

If no special diet menu is in place by the time your pupils starts school in September, Caterlink will provide a safe meal which includes a jacket potato with baked beans or suitable toppings such as tuna mayonnaise or cheese, with vegetables and fruit for dessert, if the allergy or intolerance does not contain any of these stated foods. Or parents/guardians can provide a packed lunch from home until a special diet menu is put into place. Please be aware that we do not provide menus for different moderations or forms of allergens e.g. cant have raw egg, but can have cooked, stages of the milk or egg ladder. Within our kitchens, we exclude the allergen in full as every child has different tolerance levels for their allergens. If you are reintroducing an allergen, this should be done at home, not within the school kitchens.

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GOVERNOR NEWS

Governor Information

The governors have a strategic role supporting and challenging the Head Teacher. Governors work as a team, in the best interests of the children and the school, actively support the school in achieving an excellent standard of education.

More specifically, they:

- Appoint the Head Teacher, who has day to day responsibility for everything that happens in a school and is accountable to them.
- Agree how the school's money is allocated.
- Agree policies about the way the governing body and the school work.
- Ensure new initiatives and guidelines from the Department for Education and the education authority are put in place.

The governors do their main work in three committees, which are listed below. All committees meet regularly throughout the year and report back on their progress and matters arising at the full governors meetings. The full governing body formally meets about five times a year.

The Instrument of Government comprises of the following:

- 3 x Parent governors
- 1 x LA governor
- 1 x Staff governors
- 1 x Head Teacher
- 3 x Foundation governor
- 3 x Co-Opted governors

All governor positions term of office is 4 years.

The Governing Body endeavours to take a strategic role, act as a critical friend to the School and be accountable for its decisions.

Meet to ensure quality provision, challenging and supporting the teaching and learning in school so that pupils can make the best possible progress.

Ethos & Strategic Planning

Monitors and reviews policies and procedures and ensures the school is acting in accordance with statutory regulations together with planning for the future.

Resources & Compliance

Supports and challenges the school to ensure that resources (both physical and human) are of high quality and are implemented in accordance with the financial regulations.

Check to see if your child is eligible using the confidential online portal available on our website www.gloucestershire.gov.uk/education-and-learning/free-school-meals/

You can secure a tasty free meal for your child and **save yourself up to £480 per year**. Plus your child's school receives extra funding for each eligible child registered.

If you receive a qualifying benefit, your child's school is entitled to extra funding. So even if you don't want your child to take a free meal, you should still apply to make sure that their school receives all the government funding to which it is entitled - helping them provide your child with the best education and support.

Children in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 already receiving an Universal Infant Free School Meal arranged by their school will still have to apply to enable their school to get any extra funding. If you do not have access to a computer or the internet, speak to your child's school.
